## Online Courses

- Must be highly motivated, organized and effective with time management.
- Must complete at least $40 \%$ by the end of the quarter to receive CR for that quarter.
- Select Online 21F (21000) on course form.
- Complete the online course application and return to the guidance office by March 4.


## Dual Credit Courses

- School District pays the tuition fee.
- Must have a minimum Accuplacer Test Scores (test taken at LMC), ACT or SAT scores.
- Dual credit is available for World History. Talk to your teacher about the difference between World History-DC and World History to determine which is better for you.

## Building Master Schedule

- Student Centered
- Number of students who sign up determines number of sections
- Be sure to plan your schedule carefully! Making schedule changes can be difficult and other times just not possible


## Teacher Recommendations

- Teachers will inform students what course should be taken the following year in that subject area
- When selecting these courses online, students will only be able to choose (click on) courses for which they have been approved


## 4 Steps

1. Work with parents to select 6 courses + 3 alternates.
2. Complete Course Selection Form (due in guidance office by March 4th, 3pm).
3. Parent signature required on form.
4. Enter courses in PowerSchool through PIV (Parent Portal) starting February 21-March 1, by 3pm.

## Course Selection Form

- Write name and next year's grade.
- Note semester or year-long courses.
- Complete the "schedule grid," using course numbers.


## Instructions for Online Selection

- Enter Parent Portal (Parent Internet Viewer).
- Click on "Class Registration".
- Click on "pencil icon" to select a course in a subject area.
- Select box next to appropriate course.
- Click "okay".
- Continue until you have selected enough courses for 6 credits + 3 alternates.
- For schedule modifications that are not recognized in Powerschool, see your counselor.
